FM Verifications in Brookings

Dr. Kristine Miller and Outreach consultant Julie Delfs did FM verifications for the Brookings School District. A pediatric audiologist needs to perform FM verification because it ensures that a child's FM system (used to improve hearing in noisy environments like a classroom) is delivering the correct sound level and quality directly to their devices, maximizing the benefit they receive from the technology and allowing them to fully participate in classroom activities without being hindered by background noise. This verification is crucial for students's speech and language development and overall access to the classroom environment. Dr. Miller and Julie's collaborative efforts made sure this happened for the students in Brookings.



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Signing Saturdays in Spearfish

We had a great turn out at our five week Signing Saturday series here in Spearfish. Thank you to the Jitter Joint for hosting and for the collaboration from SD Deaf Resources and Outreach Program. Outreach Professional Development

The SDSD Outreach Consultants participated in a valuable professional development training during Fall 2024, enhancing their skills and knowledge to better serve deaf and hard of hearing students. The training included software sessions, CAPD training with Dr. Marni Johnson, a discussion with Meaghan Neuberger from SD Hands & Voices, and CPR certification. A highlight of the event was the motivational speaker presentation, which provided inspiration and renewed focus for our work. This training also served as a great opportunity for team building, allowing consultants—who are spread out across South Dakota—to connect in person. Strengthening our skills and relationships ensures we continue providing high-quality support to the families and students we serve.

SDSD Partners with USD

South Dakota Services for the Deaf (SDSD) Outreach Consultants assisted in the University of South Dakota (USD) Speech and Hearing Outreach Clinic in Rapid City on October 24th and 25th. West River families were given the opportunity to have their child's cochlear implant and osseointegrated device services provided closer to home. SDSD Outreach Consultants partnered with Rapid City Area Schools (RCAS) and the USD Scottish Rite Speech and Hearing Clinic. Evaluations were performed at the RCAS Jefferson Building. Special thanks to Julie Hintgen, RCAS Educational Audiologist, and Dr. Keyra Comer, Director of Special Services, for providing a location for this clinic. Dr. Jessica Messersmith, with three audiology students, and Dr. Mandy Williams, with three speech-language pathology (SLP) students, saw 15 kids for audiology and speech appointments. Various services were provided: cochlear implant programming appointments, osseointegrated device programming appointments, consultation/evaluation appointments, communication support, and language evaluations. The six graduate students from the University of South Dakota participated in the outreach clinic as a part of their doctoral and master's programs. The next cochlear implant outreach clinic is scheduled for the Spring of 2025.

Signing Santa in Spearfish & Sioux Falls

Signing Santa made his rounds to Spearfish and Sioux Falls and the event brought holiday magic to children who are deaf and hard of hearing and their families. Presentation at Dakota Wesleyan University

Mindy Childs' first introduction to students with hearing difficulties was as a case manager for a student with Cochlear Implants. Because of this, she has developed an understanding of accommodations and modifications specific to hearing differences by having an SDSD outreach consultant on their multidisciplinary team. Mrs. Childs, now a professor at Dakota Weslyn University, finds it essential that the next generation of teachers have the basic knowledge of hearing differences before entering the classroom. These future teachers student-teach in South Dakota. SDSD serves nearly 700 students with hearing differences, so the likelihood of having a student who uses some hearing equipment in their classroom is high. That said, Laura Scholten and Jodi Schnider were tasked with presenting Hearing Differences 101 to 12 future elementary education teachers. We appreciate the opportunity to provide this experience for them!
